Photo Types & Techniques

- 1. Night Photography** (Night Photography refers to the activity of capturing images outdoors at night, between dusk and dawn.)
- 2. Nature Photography** (Nature Photography is a wide range of Photography taken outdoors and devoted to displaying natural elements such as landscapes, wildlife, plants and close-ups of natural scenes and textures.)
- 3. Long Exposure Photography** (Long-exposure involves using a long-duration shutter speed to sharply capture the stationary elements of images while blurring, smearing, or obscuring the moving elements.)
- 4. Street Photography** (Street photography, is photography conducted for art or enquiry that features unmediated chance encounters and random incidents within public places.)
- 5. Wildlife Photography** (Wildlife photography is a genre of photography concerned with documenting various forms of wildlife in their natural habitat. *Wild or Captive Wildlife*)
- 6. Light Painting** (Light painting is a photographic technique where light is “painted” or “drawn” into the photograph using a hand held light source during a long exposure.)
- 7. Lens Flare Effect** (A lens flare happens when light is scattered or flared in a lens system, often in response to a bright light, producing a sometimes undesirable artifact in the image.)
- 8. Silhouette** (Silhouette is the image of a person, animal, object or scene represented as a solid shape of a single color, usually black, with its edges matching the outline of the subject.)
- 9. Light Trails** (Light trail photography is a type of long exposure photography that highlights the movement of light. By keeping the camera shutter open for a long period of time, you can collect more light and in this case show how that light moves across the frame. *Stars or Cars*)
- 10. Motion Blur** (Motion blur is a photographic technique that involves using a slow shutter speed to allow moving subjects to blur through the frame. You can blur motion significantly with a faster-moving subject and a slower shutter speed, or just slightly with a small amount of movement during a slightly faster shutter speed.)
